

## Seasonal Segments Patch

Use these segments as a great incentive to encourage participation through the year. Four individual patches...one for each season of the year. Each patch is wedge shaped so that all four can be combined to make a large 4" diameter circular logo.

**Spring Fling.....**When the wind picks up and really starts to blow, it's time to dust off your kite. Bright yellow, orange, and purple kites in different styles are sewn on a light sky blue fabric. Red border and lettering are feature on each patch.



**Autumn Event.....**As the nights get colder and the days grow shorter, the leaves being to change colors. Three Colorful leaves sewn in brown, bronze and bright orange with brown stitched veins. Light sky blue fabric.

**Winter Wonder.....**Cold days with lots of rain and snow may change our schedule a little, but won't slow us down. Friendly white snowman with navy blue top hat and blue and red scarf. White snowflakes fall on top of light sky blue fabric.

**Summer Sizzle.....**Warm sunny weather allows us to begin all types of fun outdoor activities. This bright orange sun is sporting purple shades and a purple smile. Golden yellow rays emanate from the sun on top of a light sky blue fabric.
